## **CHURCH HISTORY PROJECT**

Context: Individual Focus: Competencies

This project must be completed <u>after</u> the New Testament Introduction Project is fully completed.

This project has 2 tracks. If you are called to be a teacher, you must do the Big Track.

## **Big Track:**

1. Complete the course, *Survey of Church History* by Garth Rosell.

This course includes:

- 24 audio tapes with corresponding printed lessons. Do <u>not</u> write out your answers to the questions asked in "Focus" or "Develop" sections; just think about them. Please <u>do</u> the additional readings from both Shelley and Noll, and watch the videos mentioned. Scan the biblical portions mentioned in the lessons.
- Two examination papers: after Lessons 12 and 24. You will do these exams.
- One research paper. Please do this. It can be on any subject in Church History. Please use any of the following from the ConneXions library:

- 5. At the end of the project please affirm that you have effectively read/skimmed the required texts, listened to the required tapes and watched the required videos for this project.

## **Little Track:**

- 1. Listen to the tapes from the course, *Survey of Church History* by Garth Rosell. This course includes:
  - 24 audio tapes with corresponding printed lessons. Do <u>not</u> write out your answers to the questions asked in "Focus" or "Develop" sections; just think about them. Please <u>do</u> the *required* reading for each lesson (any optional reading is optional) and watch the videos mentioned. Scan the biblical portions mentioned in the lessons. You will <u>not</u> do the exams or the research paper.
